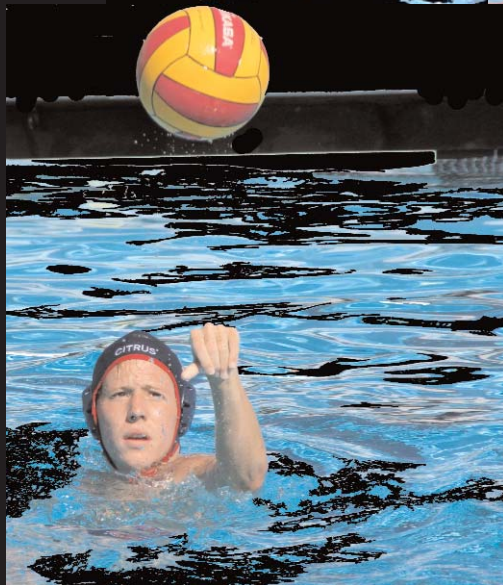

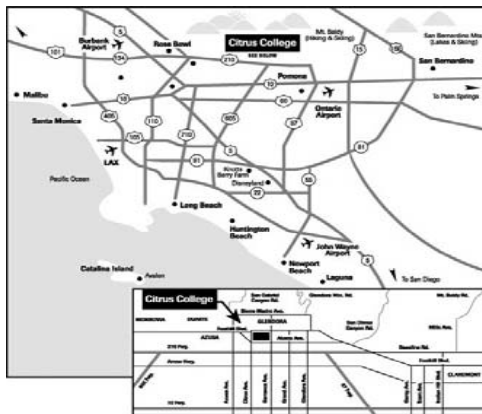

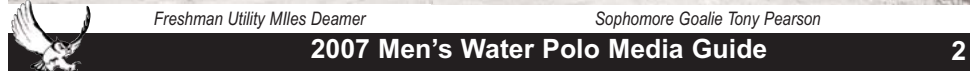

Season Preview

Fighting Owls Look for Continued Growth in 2007

It's been six years since the Citrus College men's water polo team won their first-ever state championship, and only the second state championship in Citrus history. In that time, the Fighting Owls have seen a lot of changes, including one at the top from legendary coach Bill Ralls to current head coach Stephen Smith.

Since taking over four short seasons ago, Smith has faced an uphill battle trying to re-establish Citrus as a state powerhouse. While the trend has been slow, the Fighting Owls have made progress every season under Coach Smith, winning more games each season and never finishing lower in conference than they did the previous season.

"Ultimately, I have been the only constant in the four plus seasons. I feel I have grown as a person and a coach since I was 23 years old coaching college water polo by myself. Although I didn't think so at the time, I was over my head at that level," Smith said. "I have survived the 'trial by fire' and have come out better because of it. I feel that I am constantly learning and experimenting to become a better teacher, motivator, and recruiter."

"Slowly but surely we are getting there. We have some good talent in the program. Most of these guys are big, athletic, hard working, and more importantly, freshmen," Smith said. "There is no doubt in my mind this team will be better than last year. If I can keep this group together and have another good recruiting class, I feel like we have a good chance of being a state contender again."

While this year may be yet another brick in the rebuilding process, the future is certainly bright with such a young and talented team. With players like Miles Deamer, Justin Coy, and Aylton Yamamoto to rebuild around, the future is certainly sunny. Add to the mix the experience of sophomores, Adam Domenici, Bryce Mordoff, and Brandon Rivas, and the Fighting Owls may find themselves contending a little sooner than they thought.

Drivers

The Owls are deep at the driver position, with almost eight players that are familiar with the spot. Leading the way for the Owls will be Coy, Yamamoto, and Mordoff.

Coy comes to the Owls after playing his senior year for a very good Temple City High School squad, where he earned 2nd team All-CIF honors. "Justin is strong, athletic, and a very good shooter," Smith said. "He may have an adjustment period early in the season, but I expect good things from him."

Yamamoto comes to Citrus after being a 1st team All-CIF honoree as a junior, and a 3rd team All-CIF honoree as a senior at Los Altos High School. "Aylton is a diminutive left hander who makes up for his size with speed and tenacity," Smith said. "If Aylton improves his pool vision and passing, he will provide the balance we need in our half-court and 6 on 5 offenses."

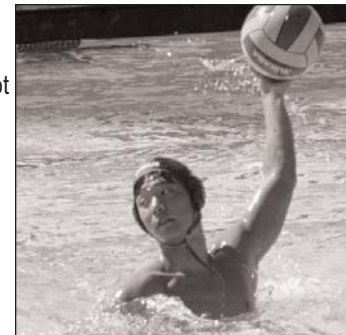
Mordoff is the veteran driver of the team, and will come in and provide some much needed depth off the bench. "Bryce worked very hard last year to become an integral part of the team," Smith said. "He accepted some challenges to improve in the off season and seems poised to continue his improvement into the season."

2-Meters

If the Owls have one weakness on this squad it comes from their lack of depth at the 2-meters position. Citrus will continue to grow in this area as the season goes along, and will be led by Brad Beintma, a freshman, and sophomore Brandon Rivas.

Beintma, a local product out of Charter Oak, was a 1st team All-CIF selection as a junior, and the Miramonte-League MVP as a senior. "Brad is a big boy who is very athletic and has a lot of raw talent," Smith said. "He needs to work on his swimming and fundamentals but should be a force in both offensive and defensive 2 meters."

Rivas gets back into the water after sitting last year out, due to transferring from NCAA Division III Pomona Pitzer. "Brandon has played at the four year level and has experience coaching," Smith said. "Because of his age, responsibility, and leadership qualities, Brandon will be our captain this year."

Utility

Some of Citrus' best talent comes from the Utility spot, where Adam Domenici and Miles Deamer are. Domenici is a red-shirt transfer from Mt. SAC, and Deamer is a freshman from South Pasadena where he was a 3rd team All-CIF honoree.

"Adam will provide some leadership and knowledge to a young team. If his shoulder can hold up, he should have a big season," Smith said. "Miles brings some size, speed, and a lot of athleticism. Everybody seems to feed off of his hard work in every aspect of practice. Miles will have a very successful season if he can refine his fundamentals and fit in a system."

Goalie

Sitting in goal for the Fighting Owl's this season will be returning sophomore Tony Pearson. According to Smith, Pearson is a lanky athlete who was a 2nd team All-WSC selection in 2006.

"Tony is hard working and very dedicated," Smith said. "As his instincts improve, and as he becomes more comfortable, he should be a force as our last line of defense."

With the 2007 season in front of them, the Fighting Owls will continue to keep putting the bricks in place, to rebuild themselves into a state contender once again. "We have the right components," Smith said. "All it is going to take is some hard work and dedication."



Coaches Profiles

Head Coach Stephen Smith



Head Men's Water Polo Coach Steve Smith brings a storied career to the table for the Owls. A former Owl himself Smith played 2 years of Water Polo at Citrus where he was a All-American honoree, 1st Team All-WSC selection in 1998 and 1999, and the Citrus Male Athlete of the Year in 2000.

After playing at Citrus, Smith went on to transfer to NCAA Division III University of La Verne, where the accolades kept on coming. Smith was a two-time Division III All-American for the Leopards. In 2000 and 2001, he was also named to the All-SCIAC team, and in 2002 Smith was named the University of La Verne's Male Athlete of the Year. Along with

playing water polo, Smith was a well-rounded enough athlete to have played for the baseball teams at both Citrus and La Verne.

Once his playing days were over, Smith began to transfer his success to the coaching realm. Smith spent one year with the University of La Verne as the Assistant Men's and Women's Coach. While there, his squad took 2nd place in the SCIAC.

Smith, who is in his fifth season with the Fighting Owls, has begun a tedious rebuilding process, and the Owls have responded, winning more games each season and placing higher in the Western States Conference ever year that Smith has been at Citrus. He has coached the Fighting Owls to a 43-74 record during his tenure.

Along with his duties at Citrus, Smith also serves as the Assistant Head Coach with the Foothill Club Water Polo Team, where his squad performed well, finishing in 11th place at the Junior Olympics.

Smith graduated from the University of La Verne with his bachelor's degree in business administration in 2002, and obtained his masters degree in physical education from Azusa Pacific University in 2004. Smith is an avid golfer and traveler. Smith, the son of Anita and Wayne Smith, has a twin brother Sean and a sister Sarah. He resides in Brea, CA

Assistant Coach Tim Kyle

Assistant Coach Tim Kyle is in his fifth season with the Citrus College men's water polo program. Along with his duties on the men's team, Kyle also serves as the women's water polo head coach and the men's swimming head coach.

Kyle's academic career began at Citrus, where he was a student for two years. Upon leaving Citrus, Kyle moved on to the University of La Verne, where he graduated with his bachelor's degree in 1997. After obtaining his bachelor's he went on to get his masters degree from Azusa Pacific University, where he graduated in 1998.

Kyle's coaching career began in the same place his collegiate playing days started, right here at Citrus College. Kyle has been the head men's swimming coach for the past 10 seasons, coaching various All-American honorees as well as many future Division I transfers. For the last three years Kyle has also served as assistant women's swimming coach. Kyle was also the head women's soccer coach for six years.

Along with his duties at Citrus College Kyle also is a personal trainer and automotive detailer. Kyle enjoys camping with his family, loves going to the river and boating, and maintains that he is physically active all the time. Kyle is married to Tricia and has a step-son named Tyler. Kyle and his wife welcomed their newest addition to their family, Taylor Anne, in August.



Assistant Coach Justin Anguiano

Coach Anguiano begins his first season on the Citrus College coaching staff. While it may be his first season, Coach Anguiano is no stranger to the Fighting Owls as he was a member of the Citrus College State Championship team in 2000. Anguiano brings a winning tradition and a storied high school career to the Fighting Owls.

Anguiano's playing career began at Rowland High School where he was a four-year varsity letterman. While at Rowland Anguiano's teams won three CIF Championships and

Anguiano was named CIF Player of the Year on two separate occasions. After graduating from high school, Anguiano moved to Citrus College, where along with their State Championship run in 2000, he earned All-American honors.

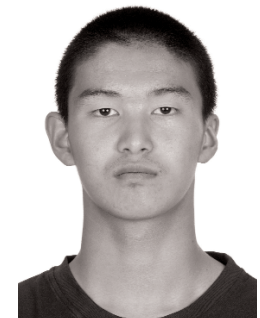

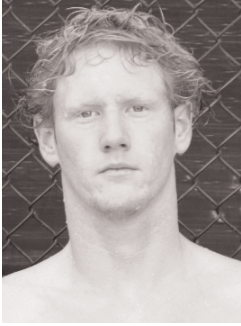

Facilities



Citrus College is home to some of the finest facilities in all of Southern California. Citrus College boasts a unique pool complex, housing our swimming and water polo teams. The beautiful facility was given a face-lift in 2005, and a new state-of-the-art scoreboard was added to the venue. The Citrus College Aquatic Center is regularly selected as the site for regional championship events.

Citrus also has two weight rooms to accommodate different training needs.
