**ESL 030 English Language Skills III 3 Units**

Placement is based on multiple assessment measures or successful completion of ESL Level 2 core courses--ESL 020, 024 and ESL 026.

A course for intermediate English language students providing additional practice in the four language skills--listening, speaking, reading and writing. Emphasis on vocabulary building, developing fluency in speaking, increasing written sentence complexity and developing reading skills. One of three core courses in ESL Level 3 54 lecture hours. 9 lab hours arranged.

**HEAL 100 Emergency Medical Services Career Preparation 3 Units**

 Health Occupations 100 is designed to provide the student with the knowledge and skills necessary to begin an entry-level career in Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and other allied health-related fields of patient care. This course provides beginning concepts of preparatory sciences directly related to the care of sick and injured persons. It also covers the knowledge and skills necessary for American Heart Association (AHA) cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certification and first aid certificate for healthcare providers. Successful completion of this course is required for enrollment into the Emergency Medical Technician Basic Program. This course may be taken two times. 36 lecture hours, 54 lab hours.
